The City of St. Louis has a wonderful history book, published by local author Dave McMacken, written in 2003 on the City's 150th Anniversary. In 2006 another book was published about the huge Victorian "Castle" on the corner of M-46 and Delaware Street. 2008 will see a revised version of *The Saratoga of the West*, the story of the Magnetic Mineral Springs in St. Louis. Finally, a \$700,000 Enhancement Project was completed with MDOT in 2008 that included the Historical Society Depot Museum area on Crawford Street.
